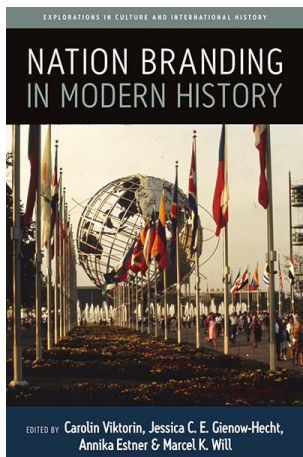


# Explorations in Culture and International History

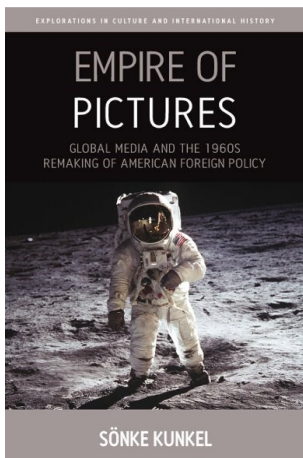
